A.L.I.C.E.

- History of A.L.I.C.E.
- *Response options:
 - Alert
 - Lockdown
 - Inform
 - <u>Counter</u>
 - <u>E</u>valuate







PRIOR TO A.L.I.C.E.

- Barricade
- Schools spoke in code
- Passive response



WHEN IS A.L.I.C.E. ENACTED?

- When there is an active shooter or a threat inside the school, or on school grounds
- Note about "Secure the Building"





- Initial awareness
- Provide as much information as possible
- Use all available means to get information out
 - Text Messages, Public Address
 System, Internet District
 Homepage and Social Media
- Schools utilize building security cameras to provide real time information with police
- Use plain language

A.L.I.C.E. STRATEGY:

ALERT



- Know where the threat is but can't evacuate safely
- Don't know where the threat is, but evacuation could be dangerous
- Barricade and secure the door
- Move to safe area within the room
- Prepare to evacuate if given the opportunity

A.<u>L.</u>I.C.E. STRATEGY:

LOCKDOWN



WHEN/THEN SCENARIO: LOCKDOWN

How would we lockdown and barricade this room?

Take a few minutes to talk with your neighbor(s) about what you would do.



- Share real time information
- Use the information to make the best decision on action



A.L.<u>I</u>.C.E. STRATEGY:

INFORM




- Last resort
- Distract shooters ability to shoot accurately
- Move towards exits while throwing objects
- Adults swarm shooter
- Age appropriate personal choice



KEEP EACH OTHER SAFE

What should a student, parent or staff member do if they see or hear any threat of violence?

ALERT or **INFORM** an adult about your concern. **A.**L.**I.**C.E.

COMMUNICATION PLAN

- Student Safety & Parent Notification
- Always check the District/school websites and social media
- Make sure we have updated contact information, including emergency phone numbers
- Sign up for text messages
 - Be sure on 'student verification form' cell phone number is in correct field (cell phone, not home phone)



HOW PARENTS CAN HELP

- Communicate with your child about school safety
 - Not bringing anything that could be considered a weapon to school
 - Airsoft guns
 - BB guns
 - Pocket knifes
 - If you see something, say something
 - Appropriate use of social media
- Monitor your child's social media accounts
- Pay attention to any sudden changes in mood or behaviors
- Report concerns to the police, principal or school social worker
- Ensure students do not have access to weapons
- Ensure the school has current contact information
- If there is a school security incident:
 - Refer to district website for updated information
 - Maintain a safe distance away from the school
